

# Memory Lab at Centre Branch

#### **Preserving Memories for the Future**

The Wicomico Public Library is excited to announce the launch of its new Memory Lab, a service to help community members preserve personal memories. Opened in January 2025, the lab offers a hands-on way to digitize materials like VHS tapes, photos, and more. Currently, the Memory Lab is located only at the Centre Branch in The Centre at Salisbury Mall. However, once the new Parsonsburg location opens, there will be a second lab available.

#### How the Lab Works:

Guests should schedule a phone appointment to share details about the materials they wish to digitize and receive instructions on what to bring, such as a flash drive or memory card. During their two-hour appointment, guests will receive guidelines and step-bystep instructions for the self-service lab, with staff available to assist if needed. The lab is free, but a small fee for prints: 20 cents for black-and-white and 50 cents for color. High-quality photo paper will be available soon at an additional cost.

#### **Digitizing a Variety of Media**

The Memory Lab offers tools to digitize 8mm reel-to-reel movies, VHS tapes, cassette tapes, photos, film negatives, slides, floppy discs, vinyl records, and large items like books or oversized pictures. Future upgrades will include digitizing sound recordings on tape and a wider range of visual and audio recordings.

#### **The Digitization Process**


Digitizing materials is a mostly self-service process, allowing guests to work at their own pace. Photos, negatives, and slides are scanned in seconds, while reel-to-reel tapes, cassettes, and vinyl records take as long as the recording's playback time to digitize.

Once the materials are digitized, guests can save the files onto their own storage devices such as a flash drive, external drive, or memory card. If the guest does not have their own storage device, the library will also offer thumb drives and memory cards for sale. While the memory lab ensures files are saved to a physical device, the future sharing and distribution of the media will be the responsibility of the guest. Staff will be available to answer any questions during the appointment.

This project was made possible in part by the Institute of Museum and Library Services.

The Memory Lab is an exciting step forward in preserving the history of Wicomico County. Personal memories such as old photos, family videos, and recordings can be some of the most meaningful connections we have to the past. However, as technology continues to advance and formats change, these memories can be lost forever. The lab ensures that important pieces of personal and family history are digitized, so they can be remembered and enjoyed with formats compatible with current technology. By offering this service, the Wicomico Public Library is helping to preserve living history in our community that can be enjoyed by future generations.





# Community Spotlight - TidalHealth



## REACH for the Future with TidalHealth and the Library

Be on the lookout for upcoming REACH programs hosted by the Wicomico Public Library! TidalHealth and the Wicomico Public Library are partnering to bring tools and resources to help you prevent and control diabetes, high blood pressure, and other chronic health conditions. Enjoy free health programs including screenings, education, and engaging presentations where you can learn how to live a healthier lifestyle. You can find classes and screenings hosted at the Paul S. Sarbanes Branch in Downtown Salisbury and the Centre Branch in the Centre at Salisbury Mall.

These free services are made possible through the REACH (Rural Equity and Access to Community Health) program. The program is funded through a grant provided by the Maryland Community Health Resources Commission – the Health Equity Resource Communities (HERC) grant. The program aims to address health disparities, improve health outcomes, expand access to primary care and prevention services, reduce health care costs, and advance health equity.

REACH services are developed by a diverse coalition of community partners working together to help individuals prevent or control diabetes and high blood pressure. Services include:

- Free health programs and presentations
- Free classes to learn how to live a healthier lifestyle
- Free help connecting to community services and resources like food, housing, and transportation
- Free help finding healthcare providers

Services are designed based on community input and data captured that shows neighborhoods in the most need of improvement for accessing healthcare on the Lower Eastern Shore. The program also aims to address social drivers of health (SDOH), which have a major impact on people's access to healthcare and their health outcomes. These are non-medical social factors that affect health such as lack of transportation, access to literacy, education, economic stability, neighborhood, and environment. The program addresses these SDOH factors that are causing health disparities in our medically underserved communities by bringing health education programs and opportunities directly to those individuals in the neighborhoods where they live.

The REACH program has many strategies to impact our community. Some include health screenings, educational classes, healthy lifestyle programming, and clinical intervention programs for people with diabetes or high blood pressure. TidalHealth's community health educator, Bobbi McDonald, offers healthy lifestyle programming including education and activities on nutrition, physical activity, stress management, and chronic disease prevention and self-management. The programs offer an opportunity to learn the skills to create a sustainable healthy lifestyle.

TidalHealth and its partners are working in an innovative, hands-on fashion to improve the health outcomes of our community. Social factors should never hinder one's ability to live a healthy life. With the help of our team and supportive partnerships with other community-based organizations, such as the Wicomico Public Library, we hope to expand care and health literacy with a goal of improving the collective health of our communities. The Delmarva Peninsula is a wonderful place to call home and we're working to make it a healthful thriving community for all. We invite you to attend a program, stop in for a health assessment, or say hello when you see us in your neighborhood. At TidalHealth we are Better Together.




